See the petroglyphs at Washington State Park in De Soto and/or explore the archaeology and paleontology of Mastodon State Historic Site .	Watch the film More Than One Thing at the Ethical Society on May 31, 7 PM.	Take advantage of a long weekend to explore the Saint Joseph Museums .	Explore the arts of many different people and cultures at the Saint Louis Art Museum .
Take a day trip to gain a better understanding of the forced relocation of 9 Cherokee Indian groups at the Trail of Tears State Park .	Visit Cahokia Mounds World Heritage site (highlight: Summer Solstice observance on June 19).	Explore and learn about the Native American tribes for whom your home is ancestral land.	Visit the George Washington Carver National Monument and learn about his life story and achievements.	Experience the artistic talents of regional and national African American artists by visiting the Vaughn Cultural Arts Center .
Explore STL area zip codes and patronize a restaurant locally owned by People of Color.	Watch Amy Hunter's TED talk on "lucky zip codes" and/or learn about local neighborhoods through walking tours .	BINGO	Shop at EyeSeeMe bookstore and then bookmark the Black Pages , a directory of Black-owned businesses in St. Louis.	Attend a Juneteenth Celebration at Fairground Park , the Missouri History Museum , in the Delmar Loop , or a place of your choosing.
Enjoy the music at the National Blues Museum and/or visit Scott Joplin's house to learn more about his contributions to ragtime.	Celebrate the many people and cultures of Saint Louis at the Festival of Nations on August 27 - 28.	Immerse yourself in the Chinese Culture Days and/or the Japanese Festival at the Missouri Botanical Gardens.	Experience the Taste of North St. Louis on July 16.	Explore the pleasures of craft beer at Saint Louis Hop Shop and/or brighten someone's day with flowers from Urban Buds City Grown Flowers .
Learn about a stop on the Underground Railroad at the Old Stone Meeting House .	Road trip to Kansas City and visit the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum .	Visit the Old Courthouse to learn about Dred Scott and/or honor his memory by visiting his gravesite at Calvary Cemetery.	Learn about Elijah Lovejoy and honor his memory by visiting a monument in his honor in Alton, IL.	Visit the Gateway Arch museum to learn about the history of this area and its people.
